

## A Visit to Thorncliffe

Youngsters That Look Good and Older Horses That Have Seemingly Improved With Age—A Stable That Appears Especially Strong in Two-Year-Olds.

Matters are beginning to look a little more like racing down at the Woodbine and in the neighborhood. The delightful weather of the past week did wonders in drying up the track and helping things forward generally. Trainers are decidedly more hopeful and from now on can be depended upon to rush their preparations. Already a few interesting affairs have taken place, and real work is now almost due. Up at Mr. Robert Davies' track at Thorncliffe, Johnny Walker has been able to move his charges along for some time and has put them through several useful gallops. Probably no horses ever looked better at this season than do the Thorncliffe lot. Walker is noted as a conditioner and he is certainly maintaining his reputation. A better lot of two-year-olds has rarely been my province to look at and if they only perform as well as they look there will be a few dollars earned to pay for the bin. Thorncliffe come high and take a lot of keeping. It would therefore be pleasant to be able to record the last few days of the season as a doubtful problem. If he stands up, the stable will take some beating for its Majesty's Guineas, for he is a very nice horse. Horses, however, are uncertain and Chapparral must be set down as beyond doubt one of the best. His speed and willingness leave nothing to be desired, but he has got to be produced at the post. Still the Davies stable has a chance of winning and there is less likelihood of the Valley Farm stable having things all their own way than appeared last fall, when the representatives of that confederacy were expected to win a merry clip. Instead of being a race that is all over but the shouting, as it appeared then, it begins to look as if in the last few days there will be more than one contender. Among others Harry Gidding's colt St. Bass is exceptionally highly spoken of, as indeed might be expected in view of his mile in 1:46 last autumn. It is even said that a well-known barrier offered five hundred dollars for his use on King's Plate day. This may look extravagant but it is only taking six or seven to one against his prospects. The first money probably amounting to \$3,000. But if the Davies representatives should not match the guineas the two-year-olds have an excellent chance of pulling a few punts out of the fire.

Good to Look at.  
If only for their glossy coats and proud bearing the two-year-olds, which it will be noticed that there are here ten set down, are good to look upon. But there are some apparent crackerjacks among them. Gold Bud

and St. Margaret are the only province-breds but they compare well with the juveniles bred in the United States both for quality and for size. Fair Annie has fitted out quite a bit and has every appearance of conforming her abilities as a stayer. Frolic looks like a stake horse, which means that she has improved in every way. She was good last year, as her record proves, but if appearances go for anything, the King's Plate winner Farmer, who beat her for the Broomstick Stakes, will have quite a bit to do to repeat the performance. Satin Bower has also fitted out and should pretty well better Frolic's performance in the Broomstick Stakes and repeat it in the Maple Leaf.

### The Two-Year-Olds.

The youngsters are beyond peradventure a choice lot. Possibly they are here recorded in point of merit, altho it would be a wonderful thing if this judgment proved correct. Knight's Differ is a fine rangy colt with a great middle piece and splendid rein. He has every appearance of extra merit. In fact he is racing like all over, with excellent shoulders, good underpinning and a particularly well set on neck. He somewhat in the latter respect recalls an old friend in Springfield, a son of imp. Bonnie Scotland. Stillmore is less smooth but bears the stamp of usefulness in a sort of sturdy ruggedness. Black River is a powerful fellow with shoulders and quarters that stamp him a sprinter. He is a masterly youngster that even unsexed shows a disposition to get out of bounds. Father Oia is another youngster that will never fulfill his name, having also been thrown, but he looks like picking up a dollar or two and is of a better temperament than his darker stable companion Queen Sain and Flower Girl are likely young ladies that may be looked for round the fall to show speed. If indeed they don't do something at the approaching meeting. Patience, however, in their case will bring its reward. Max Lawrence is a beauty all over. For looks she has 'em all beaten. The lady will wear her crown, but the brown filly with the twisted name that more than the literature will have trouble to wrestle with. Cesarpeia would probably beat her to a standstill in a race. But we shall see what we shall see. In the uncertainty of everything is the only certainty that the horses are at present in tip-top condition and furnish evidence of care and management.

There are three or four good-sized yearlings at the farm by the home stables: imp. Orme Shore, imp. Altes d'Or and imp. Bolsover, the first and last sons of Orme (Flying Fox's sire) and the second by Melton, Synson's lady parent. One is out of Mrs. Frank Foster and another out of Mischiefmaker, and of the family of Frolic, and another out of Lou D. With last year's crop Mr. Davies did not have the best of luck and with this year's prospects are not a great deal more favorable.

### A Grand Trotting Stallion.

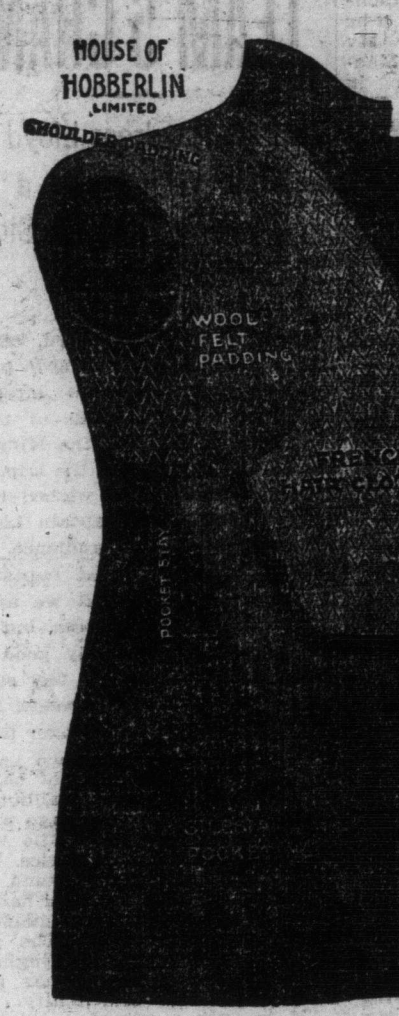
Another habitant of Thorncliffe is the grand trotting stallion Judge Parker, and a more determined, resolute-looking horse never stood on four feet. He will be remembered as having won the stallion trot at the Exhibition last fall and as traveling each heat faster than the preceding one. Judge Parker has only started eight times and has won four and been second four. For breeding he would be monstrously hard to beat, being by Jay Mc Gregor (sire of 19 trotters in the 2:30 list and 5 pacers in the 2:25 list), dam the great Paragonia, dam of County Jay, 2:06 1/4; Kentucky Todd, 2:08 1/4; Ormonde, 2:08 1/4, and others of bang-up speed.

Jas. O'Halloran, one of the old timers in the harness horse game, has bought Collingwood Rooker (pacer), 2:11 1/4, a full brother to Texas Rooker, 2:06 1/4. Both of these horses were bred by Capt. Neville of Collingwood, and developed by his son John, a clever reinsman. Jimmie also has Shaun Rhue, a green trotter that he has matured some. He is a grand, bold-going fellow, with any amount of speed, a little erratic, but with a little more work and age he should be very fast. Last summer at a matinee given by the Dufferin Driving Club, he stepped a mile handily in 2:25 flat, and was a hard to beat, being by Jay Mc Gregor (sire of 19 trotters in the 2:30 list and 5 pacers in the 2:25 list), dam the great Paragonia, dam of County Jay, 2:06 1/4; Kentucky Todd, 2:08 1/4; Ormonde, 2:08 1/4, and others of bang-up speed.

or will have her worked this summer. Aid. Sam McBride's Lady Brail (2:24 1/4), is being jogged regularly. This is a grand type of a mare. She got her mark last summer at Montreal, when she was practically green, and was raced some this winter, but did not seem to take to the ice footing. She will no doubt be paced this summer.

The prospects for the early meeting for harness horses to be given by the Dufferin Driving Club, commencing May 31, and continuing June 1 and 2, are brighter every day. The opening harness meeting at Osawa, May 24 and 25, is assured of success. A great list of entries is the word from the popular secretary, Dr. C. E. Kaiser. First day 2:25 pace and 2:20 trot; second day 2:30 trot and free for all. All purses \$300.
