ATTEMPTED SUICIDE FROM LIGHT POLE. Chinese Drops From Crossbar at End of Twelve Foot Rope—Rescued by Policeman

Montreal, Sept. 15—One of the most spectacular attempts ever made at committing suicide in this city was made by a Chinese, who attempted to end his life by hanging himself to an electric light pole at the corner of St. Urban and LaGauchetiere streets, in the heart of Chinatown.

The attempt was frustrated by quick work on the part of Constable Berlinget, who was assisted by Constable Lessard. The police reached the Chinese as he was dangling from the end of a twelve-foot rope, but managed to cut him down and lower him from the pole before he had succeeded in strangling himself. Constable Berlinget, before entering the police force, was a line-man in the employ of the Montreal Light, Heat & Power Co., and it was his ability to climb the pole that saved the life of the Chinese.
