REDUCE LUMBER RATES. Vancouver, April 15-Freight rates on lumber and shingles shipped from British Columbia to eastern Canada, will be reduced commencing April 21, according to word received here by railway officials. The reduction will be on all railway lines and is the result of a decision on the part of the Canadian Railway Association to assist Canadian lumbermen to compete against lumbermen of the southern states. The new rates, it is said, will mean a reduction of about \$400 a thousand feet on lumber shipped to Toronto from Vancouver.


