A GRUESOME STORY

Approving of the bill in parliament providing for the execution of death in penitentiaries or central dominion prisons, the Halifax Chronicle recalls a lurid story. It says:

"The old law, which has hitherto prevailed, requiring the execution of the criminal as close as possible to the scene of his crime, was for the purpose of furnishing a supposedly impressive warning to the criminal's family and acquaintances. But that presupposed public execution which all could witness. "In one historic case in the early settlement days of Nova Scotia, a criminal who had committed murder and arson to conceal his crime, was carted from the county town where he had been imprisoned and tried, seated on his intended coffin, with the fatal noise around his neck, to a distance of some miles into the country, and there hanged on the site of the house which he had committed the murder, which he had committed. That site is known as Hanging Hill to this day, and probably always will be, for it is an object of superstition."

DR. F. X. MORRIS INDICTED.

In the afternoon session of the circuit court the grand jury found a true bill in the case of the King vs. Francis X. VICE ADMIRAL OF UNITED KINGDOM

Naming of Sir Francis Bridgman for This Ancient Position.

(London Times.)

The appointment, announced in the Times on Saturday, of Sir Francis Bridgman to be vice-admiral of the United Kingdom in succession to Sir Michael Culme-Seymour, resigned, serves to remind us of the continued existence of a very old and honorable office. In brief, the vice-admiral of the United Kingdom is the deputy of the lord high admiral, whether that office be held by one man or by a board of lords commissioners. Some short excerpts from the patent granted to Sir George Rooke in 1702, at vice-admiral of England, will serve to show what was, and potentially still is, the nature of the vice-admiral's duties. "We do hereby give and grant unto the said Sir George Rooke full power and authority under the great seal of Great Britain, bearing date the 10th day of January in the 1st year of the said King's Majesty, to the said Sir George Rooke, his heirs, assigns, and successors, to discharge the duties belonging to him; but if during the late war the said Sir George Rooke had been called upon to discharge the duties of the office of the admiralty and putting all his lords commissioners out of action at once, the vice-admiral of the United Kingdom would have come into his own, and would have been called upon to discharge the functions of admiralty pending the appointment of a new board.

The office of vice-admiral of England does not appear to have taken on its final form until August, 1872, when Prince Rupert was appointed to hold it. His immediate predecessor was George Monck, Duke of Albemarle, who, when the Duke of York, then lord high admiral, went abroad in command of the fleet in 1665, was appointed informally by him to act as his deputy ashore. And in 1688 Howard, the lord high admiral, being designated for service at sea as commander-in-chief against the Spanish Armada, appointed the great Lord Burghley as his deputy. It has been assumed that the office of vice-admiral began on April 24, 1646, when Henry VIII. by letters patent, constituted the navy board with the "lieutenant of the admiralty" as its president, and that the office of vice-admiral, with more or less undefined functions, can be traced back to the 14th century. In 1672, when the office of vice-admiral was fully standardized, that of lord high admiral was not in commission.

sion. The period of almost continuous commissions began in the following year, when the test act drove the Duke of York from office. The office of rear-admiral of the United Kingdom began in 1687, in which year, too, the lord high admiralship was not in commission. Each of these years was a time of war, or threat of war; and the cause of the appointments was the real need of having an effective understudy at the head of the administration. In 1687 the king was his own lord high admiral, and the vice-admiral was the Duke of Grafton, a minor, appointed while the admiralship was in commission. It became necessary, therefore, to introduce an experienced sea officer, and accordingly Sir Roger Stickland was appointed. Once instituted, this office, too, went on, like that of the vice-admiral, almost continuously, and still exists, its present holder being Admiral Sir Edmund Fremantle.

At the union with Scotland the style of the vice-admiral and rear-admiral of England was changed to that of "vice-admiral and rear-admiral of the United Kingdom." But during the long history of these offices, their holders have had little actual power; for the lord high admiral have been replaced by a board, whose existence is in effect continuous, their powers have necessarily been in abeyance. Indeed, at the end of last century the two offices were allowed to lapse for a generation before the appointment of Sir Michael Seymour and of Sir Edmund Fremantle in 1901.

It is hardly probable that future holders of these offices will ever be called upon to discharge the duties belonging to them; but if during the late war the Germans had succeeded in dropping a bomb into a meeting of the board of the admiralty and putting all his lords commissioners out of action at once, the vice-admiral of the United Kingdom would have come into his own, and would have been called upon to discharge the functions of admiralty pending the appointment of a new board.

CONDEMN COLONY AT KAPUSKASING

Report of the Commission Says It Was Begun Very Hastily.

Toronto, March 23.—The province has spent a large amount of money for very small returns, and the unsatisfactory conditions should have been dealt with at as much earlier date as possible. A commission appointed by the Drury government to investigate the conditions at the Kapuskasing colony, Kapuskasing. The commission was comprised of W. F. Nickle, K. C., Kingston; Col. John McNeill, Hastings; and Professor Sharpe, New Liskeard.

"All the essential facts stated in the report," the commissioners say in their findings, "were known to those in authority at least twelve months ago, and action should have been taken to deal with the situation, not only in the interests of the settlers, but also in the interests of the province as well."

"A visit to the colony leaves the impression of a general condition of untidiness and lack of care and detail. There was evidence that beef, potatoes and flour were carelessly handled, and considerable loss. From the testimony of settlers themselves, it is impossible to resist the conclusion that the province spent money much more lavishly than pioneer conditions warrant."

The report finds that the fitness of the colonists for pioneer work was not sufficiently investigated before they were sent to Kapuskasing.

Sense Recommendations.

The commission recommends a revaluation of all houses and buildings in the colony, to determine whether or not a vergerage was made for the work done for the settlers, or for materials supplied. Settlers who remain, the report states, should receive, as a gift, a horse from among those at the colony, a half set of double harness, and the sum of \$200. They should also be supplied free with seed grain for the spring's sowing. The report also recommends that the province should be advised to form a school section as quickly as possible, and the government should pay salary of the teacher or teachers for at least two years.

WOMEN CANDIDATES THROUGHOUT WINNIEG.

Women's organizations are arranging to run women candidates in every constituency in Winnipeg for the forthcoming elections for the Manitoba legislature. Announcement to this effect was made by Mrs. Paulley, secretary of the Political Educational League. A mass meeting to which every woman in the city is invited has been arranged to take place Wednesday evening, March 21, in the board of trade building, to further the proposal.
