



Shanghai, April 19—(A. P. Correspondence)—The British Chamber of Commerce of Shanghai, representing the bulk of British interests in the Far East, has put littlef on record as in favor of China's claims in the Shantung controversy. This is in line with action taken by American commercial organizations in China and is regarded as significant in view of the fact that a part of the English commercial anterprises in the Orient are linked with the Japanese.
