How to Save Wheat, Beef and Bacon for the men at the front. Issued from the Office of the Food Controller for Canada.

### MENU FOR SATURDAY.

Breakfast.  
Oatmeal Porridge War Bread  
Sausages Tea or Coffee  
Dinner.

Hamburg Steak Turnips  
Boiled Potatoes Suet Pudding  
Supper.

Tomato Scallop  
Bran Gems Preserved Plums  
Tea

The recipes for Suet Pudding and Tomato Scallop, mentioned above, are as follows:

**Suet Pudding—**  
1 cup finely chopped suet  
1/2 cup molasses  
1 cup sour milk  
2 cups graham flour  
1 cup white flour  
1 cup raisins  
1 teaspoon soda  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon each  
Ginger, Clove, Nutmeg  
1 teaspoon cinnamon

Mix and stir ingredients. Add molasses and milk to suet, combine mixtures. Turn into buttered mould, cover and steam three hours.

**Tomato Scallop—**  
2 cups buttered and seasoned bread crumbs  
1 cup tomatoes cooked and strained  
Put in alternate layers of crumbs and tomatoes with crumbs on top. Put in the oven until brown.

## BLUE ARM BANDS FOR CONVALESCENT HEROES

Patients of Military Convalescent Hospitals to Receive Special Badge of Honor

The "Blue Badge of Honor" familiar to everyone in England as the mark of a man suffering from disabilities incurred in his country's service, will appear in Canada soon when the 11,888 men on the strength of the Military Hospitals Commission Command will receive blue arm bands.

The blue band will distinguish the man who has done his bit from the men of the new reinforcement units, and will be worn by all soldiers who are patients of the military convalescent hospitals in Canada.

Of the 11,888 men who are eligible for this honor today, 9,888 are patients enrolled for treatment in the convalescent hospitals, 1,888 are patients in sanatoria, and 744 patients in various other hospitals.

With the opening of 1917 there were only 2,020 men on the strength of the command, but as the transports have been taking the newly troops across, the hospital ships have been bringing the invalids back, and the increase in the population of the convalescent hospitals has been steady.

It has now become advisable here, as in England, to issue to the men who are patients in the hospitals and at present disqualified for further service, some mark which makes them distinguishable from fresh forces.

The "Blue Badge of Honor" will hereafter enable the public to identify those men who have sacrificed so much for their country's cause and who have not as yet recovered sufficiently to be discharged.

### BALFOUR HAD CLOSE CALL

German Sub Attempted to Sink Ship on Which He Was Traveling

Kansas City, Mo., Jan. 11.—The story of an attempt by a German submarine to sink the ship with Arthur J. Balfour, British Secretary for Foreign Affairs, on the return trip to England, after his visit to the United States, and of the destruction of the submarine by an American war vessel, is told in a letter to H. F. Wright, a broker here. In making the announcement of the receipt of the letter, Mr. Wright said it was from an "American business man now located in Canada," who was a passenger on the ship with Mr. Balfour.

The letter says that the steamship was the Baltic and that it left New York August 27. After three days' sailing course it reached Halifax and remained there eleven days. On September 4 it was "joined by fourteen convoys from New York and thirty destroyers," and the trip was begun. Out at sea, the letter says, eight British men-of-war joined them.

"At seven o'clock September 14," the letter goes on, "as we were entering the English channel, our captain got a rocket from a British trawler that was anchored for the night, which notified him that there was a submarine back of him, on receipt of which information he turned his ship at right angles and the shot intended for us passed by. The American war vessel that was on our left enveloped itself in a dense black smoke and was on top of the submarine before it could adjust itself to submerge, and blew it up."
