Cattle Shipments This Week CONSTIPATION! Largest Here in Many Years

This week has witnessed the largest cattle shipments through the port for any week in many years. Three steamships have loaded about 1,450 head. Next week 1,100 head will be taken by the Carmia.

GRAIN SHIPMENTS.

In the grain trade thus far about 1,000,000 bushels have been shipped through the C. P. R. elevators on the west side at the present time 1,839,000 bushels including 275 carloads on the tracks in the Bay Shore yard. The company also has at present 1,400 to carloads between Montreal and Saint John with about 2,250,000 more bushels.

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The C. P. R. shipments for December last year totalled 2,317,000 bushels, and it is expected that this will be exceeded before 1926 is ushered in.




