**NEW SPANISH CABINET.**  
Madrid, Nov. 8.—(By the Associated Press)—After unsuccessful efforts of various leaders to form a cabinet to take the place of the Maura government, the resignation of which was announced yesterday, Marquis De Alhucemas is said to have advised King Alfonso to entrust the task to Senor Villanueva, minister of foreign affairs in the Romanones cabinet, which resigned April 19, 1917.

**McCurdy Resigns.**  
Ottawa, Nov. 7.—F. B. McCurdy, M. P., has resigned as parliamentary under-secretary for soldiers' civil re-establishment. A successor has not yet been appointed.

**BILLIARDS.**  
Chicago, Nov. 7.—"Angie" Kieckhefer, of Chicago, defeated Charles McCourt, of Cleveland, in the second block of their world's three cushion billiard championship match tonight by a score of 30 to 20 in forty innings. Kieckhefer's high run was five. The score for the two nights played now stands: Kieckhefer, 100; McCourt, 43. The final block will be played tomorrow night.

**The Harbor Rates.**  
Local business men assembled at the board of trade rooms yesterday afternoon and held a conference with Commissioner T. H. Bullock relative to the new schedule of harbor fees. After a discussion three committees were agreed to, representing the lumbermen, wholesale grocers and the hardwaremen. They are to revise the schedule relating to their interests and make recommendations to the commissioner.

**THE EARTH QUAKED.**  
Washington, Nov. 8.—An earthquake of considerable intensity, starting at 11.30 o'clock last night and continuing until shortly after 2 o'clock this morning was recorded on seismographs at Georgetown University observatory. The maximum disturbance was at 12.30 and the distance from Washington approximately 5,900 miles.
