

Q.26 By whom does this document purport to be signed?

A.26 The Assistant D.S. & T.O. of M.D. 10. His signature is illegible to me.

Q.27 And this document was procured from.....?

A.27 From the records of A.27 Canadian Recce. Training Centre and from those in particular pertaining to the accused, Edward Chernesky.

The Prosecutor tenders the document as an exhibit.

M.F.B. 1481 is read and marked Exhibit "J", signed by the President and attached to the proceedings.

Q.28 I show you a fourth document. Will you tell the Court what it is?

A.28 This is M.F.B. 1481, certificate of costs of transportation only amounting to \$28.50, respecting the accused, H.616559 Pte. Chernesky, Edward.

Q.29 And it is.....?

A.29 Procured from the records of A.27 Canadian Recce. Training Centre, and in particular those pertaining to the accused.

Q.30 And by whom does it purport to be signed?

A.30 By Lieut. J. B. Gordon, 12th District Company, R.C.A.S.C.

Q.31 Who was the officer issuing the transportation.

A.31 Yes, he was.

The Prosecutor tenders the document as an exhibit.

M.F.B. 1481 is read and marked Exhibit "K", signed by the President and attached to the proceedings.

Q.32 I show you a fifth document. Will you tell the Court what it is?

A.32 This is M.F.B. 1482, being a certificate of costs of incidental expenses amounting to \$8.70, respecting H.616559 Tpr. Chernesky, Edward, whom I identify as the accused (indicating the accused).

Q.33 And it purports to be signed by?

A.33 Purports to be signed by H.59013 Cpl. G. Jacobson, 40th Company, Canadian Provost Corps.

Q.34 And was procured from?

A.34 This document was procured from the records of A.27 Canadian Recce. Training Centre, from those pertaining to the accused.

The Prosecutor tenders the document as an exhibit.

M.F.B. 1482 is read and marked Exhibit "L", signed by the President and attached to the proceedings.
