was HIRSH SAWTELL SHOT IN NEW HAMPSHIRE?
Doubts Thrown on Some of the Testimony—Search for Accomplices in Isaac's Crime.

Boscawen, N. H., Feb. 19.—Was Hiram Sawtell shot and killed by his brother in the state of New Hampshire? The evidence thus far brought out at the coroner's inquest would seem to indicate that such was the case, but is that evidence reliable? Four witnesses have testified that they heard three shots fired near Nutter's woods between 8 and 9 o'clock on that Wednesday evening two weeks ago, when it is supposed that the unfortunate Boston fruit dealer fell a victim to his brother's brutal avenger.

Another witness that has been mentioned is supposed to have conveyed Isaac and his dead brother on the road to East Rochester's short distance east of the place where the shots were supposed to have been heard, and that he had had some conversation with one of the occupants and that one of them appeared to be the man who the Herald man has learned, must have been mixed in his dates. The testimony presented to the coroner's jury would naturally lead to the conclusion that the shooting occurred in the town of Rochester, in the county of Stratford, in the state of New Hampshire, and unless they are prompted to take some other view in the matter, in the way of hearing, contradictory evidence, when they meet in court on the 23rd inst., it appears to be doubtful information. It is not intended to convey the impression here that the shooting positively did not take place on the New Hampshire side of the line, for a contrary opinion is held by the writer in this respect.
