The Girls' Branch of the Women's Auxiliary, of Trinity Church, met on Monday afternoon at the residence, of Mrs. A. B. Pipes.



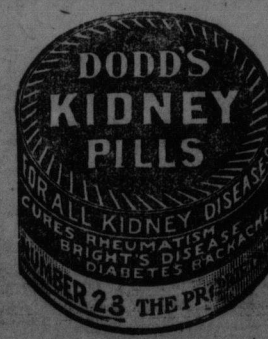
