The Treasurers in presenting the following statement of receipts and expenditure during the past year give their heartfelt thanks to the many friends of Wycliffe who have enabled them once more to close the year with a balance on hand.

It will no doubt be satisfactory to the subscribers to note that the capital of the College has increased during the year by more than \$22,000, to see that the commodious new building which the College now occupies, is practically free from debt, and to remember that in addition to these more material mercies the graduating class of 1892 is the largest that Wycliffe has yet sent forth, no fewer than twelve students having gone out into the field.

With such evident tokens of the good hand of God upon the work, the Treasurers look confidently to all former subscribers for their continued support, on which Wycliffe College is still dependent for two-thirds of its income.
