- 41. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Twenty-eight thousand four hundred and fifteen dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Collection of Revenue—Customs—Further amount required to meet salaries and contingent expenses of the several ports of entry in the various Provinces, viz.:—Nova Scotia, \$825; New Brunswick, \$900: Prince Edward Island, \$100; Quebec, \$8,890; Ontario, \$10,100; Manitoba, \$3,000: British Columbia, \$3,000; Salaries and travelling expenses of Inspectors of Ports, \$1,600, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.
- 42. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Five hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty, as compassionate allowance to Albert Coffin and family, as sufferers by the accident on the Intercolonial Railway at Lévis (Revote), for the year ending 30th June, 1897.
- 43. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One hundred and twenty-six thousand five hundred and thirty-three dollars and thirty-three cents be granted to Her Majesty, being amount required to pay for ocean mail service between Great Britain and Canada, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

The first Forty-two Resolutions, being read a second time, were agreed to. The Forty-third Resolution, being read the second time, was postponed.

The Order of the Day being read, for resuming the adjourned Debate for concurrence in the second Resolution, which was on Tuesday, 29th September last reported from the Committee of Supply, and the same was again read, as followeth:—

2. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Three thousand five hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Administration of Justice:—Salary of an additional County Judge in Manitoba, \$2,000; Additional amount required for circuit allowance, British Columbia, \$1,000; Supreme Court of Canada—Further amount required for contingencies, \$500, for the year ending 30th June, 1897;

And the Question being again proposed :—The House resumed the said adjourned

Debate

And the Question being put, That this House doth agree with the Committee in the said Resolution; the House divided: and it was resolved in the Affirmative.

The House proceeded to take into consideration the Forty-third Resolution, reported from the Committee of Supply, this day, and which Resolution was then postponed, and the same was again read, as followeth:—

43. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One hundred and twenty-six thousand five hundred and thirty-three dollars and thirty-three cents be granted to Her Majesty, being amount required to pay for ocean mail service between Great Britain and Canada, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

And the Question being put, That this House doth agree with the Committee in the said Resolution:—It was resolved in the Affirmative.

The House, according to Order, again resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.

(In the Committee.)

Resolved, That towards making good the Supply granted to Her Majesty, on account of certain expenses of the Public Service, for the financial year ending the 30th June, 1897, the sum of \$14,633,167.18 be granted out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Canada.

Resolution to be reported.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. Brodeur reported, That the Committee had come to a Resolution.

Ordered, That the Report be now received.
