Why is the Representative Slate simply promising things that are already done?

a) A Speaker Series - Building Services and External Affairs Boards are both currently running Speaker's series. This year speakers have included: Katy MacMillan of the C.D. Howe Institute, Marjorie Cohen on free trade, Peter Raymond on the media, the Federal election candidates for Strathcona, a representative from Amnesty International, and Adrian Cronauer of "Good Morning Vietnam" fame.

b) Club Directory - The Student Handbook already contains a club listing with a short blurb from

clubs making a submission. Club lists are already available at Info-desks.

c) HUB/Business Atrium Clubs Promotion — Clubs can already obtain promotion space in HUB and Tory Breezeway.

d) Book Cost Tax Deductions - There are already two education tax deductions: one for tuition and a \$60.00/month attendance tax credit which is intended to cover books. A specific tax deduction for books is not practical since it is impossible to verify that all claims are genuine. Dave Tupper has already made a submission to have this credit increased.

e) SU records - SU records will continue to exist, and the SU is already committed to ensuring its continuance in HUB Mall with an eclectic format.

f) Comparative Book Pricing - Dave Tupper has already launched a research project on Textbook prices which will be ready just shortly after the election.
