SUMMARY OF EVENTS:

- November 1 Church Parade was held in the Assembly Room for whole station. Officers' Mess Ante-Room opened.
- November 2 Sunday.
- November 3 New training syllabus of eight hours per day introduced. Station on normal routine with no untoward incident to interrupt training.
- November 4 General fire inspection. Maintenance work being carried on.
- November 5 Wing Commander Charlton from A.F.H.Q., visited the Station to look over the Hospital. Dental Officer reported and made arrangements for the opening of the Dental Clinic. Squadron Leader McKeen, from Number 1 Training Command, visited and inspected the Station. No. 6 Basketball team at Belleville. No. 6 I.T.S., defeated No. 5 I.T.S. 12-11.
- November 6 Wing Commander Marani from No. 1 Training Command and Wing Commander Clappison from A.F.H.Q., visited and inspected the Station. Discussed the possibility of building additional lecture rooms. Work on the by contractors still virtually at a standstill. Station

Squadron Leader Lee, Auxiliary Service, A.F.H.Q., and Flight Lieutenant Hopper, No. 1 Training Command, visited furning the afternoon and discussed auxiliary services. Contractors completed rement around sleepers for Drill Hall floor. Medical Selection Building in the course of being completed. 119 Trainees reported in for course No. 40, and there is practically no more room for any course.
