	25-2-41		R66197 Sgt. Smith, B.J. (flying Instructor) died 0530 hrs, in RCAF Hospital, Camp Borden, result of flying accident, 23-2-41. Funeral of LAC Shortt at Oshawa. F/L Harston this Station conducted the service. Firing party supplied by No. 1 Manning Depot.	
	26-2-41		Funeral service at 0500 hrs. in Barrie for S t. Smith, B.J. conducted by F/L Harston. Firing party and escort supplied by Security Guard, F/O Higgins in charge. Pall bearers were Sergeants from this Station. Mrs. G.H. Smith, next-of-kin (mother) acted as escort to Mount Pleasant, Michigan. Yale aircraft #3414 and #3386 collided in mid-air near Cookstown. Both aircraft write-off. Pilots LAC's Lambert & Woodill of Course #18, #2 Squadron successfully "bailed out". S/L Michelson (CFS Trenton) president of Court of Inquiry. Clear bright day. Flying all day also night flying No. 1 Squadron at Camp Borden, No. 2 Squadron at Alliston.
