Sir:-

Referring to your letter of the 10th instant, No. 1935-103:

I beg to say that it is considered preferable to employ school teachers of Missionaries at all the reserves including Split Lake and Nelson House to act as clerks at the next Treaty payments, and leave the doctor free to attend Indians who may require treatment. If the teachers of Missionaries are paid \$5.00 a day, it would seem fair remuneration. The Doctor will be allowed \$10.00 a day during the Nelson House, Split Lake and Churchill trip, being outside the limits of his territory for shioh he receives a salary.

At Churchill and York Factory you will act as clerk to Corporal Campbell.
