
Iron posts should be used to mark the boundaries as usual if these can be obtained at a reasonable outlay; if not posts of the most durable wood in the vicinity should be used and mounded similarly to the iron posts. Wooden posts should be five feet long and six inches square at important corners; all others may be five inches square.

It is considered advisable, on the score of economy and to save time, that you should arrive at your destination before the winter closes, and as you desire to pass two weeks at your home in Prince Albert before leaving, you should arrange the date of your departure accordingly.

This work is of an exceptionally expensive nature. The Department relies on your knowledge and experience to carry it out with all economy consistent with doing the work well.

The returns of your surveys may be prepared when you are again in Ottawa. Advances to the amount of two thousand two hundred dollars will be made to you on application. Further advances will be made to you on application, when funds are available, all of which you will please account for in the usual manner.
