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Ottawa, October 1, 1914.

Sir,-

On the 13th of November, 1913, Agent Rowland was given authority to sink a well for the Little Pines School. There appears to be considerable difficulty in finding water there, as by this time, although they have bored to a depth of 150 feet, no water has yet been found.

The expense incurred for digging and boring up to date is \$426.00.

The water supplied the school for use is delivered in barrels at a cost of .25 per barrel and 94 barrels have been used between January 1st and August 2nd of this year at a cost of \$23.50 or probably \$45.00 per year.

Mr. Agent Rowland has been informed that it is considered advisable to continue the purchase of water until you and he thoroughly inspect the surroundings and advise the Department if the present well is favourably located for procuring water, or if a more likely position might be chosen.

If you consider the present location as favorable as any, then the well might be continued to a
