With regard to the Upper Skeena, the Fisheries  
Department are very anxious that some fish be sent there  
and last year paid part of the expenses. Unfortunately  
Agent Mortimer handed them to the Hudson's Bay factor  
for distribution and naturally, being in competition with  
his own dried fish, were adversely reported upon.

We had more requests for fish last year than  
we had money to supply them.
