IS QUEEN ALIVE?

Rumors in Vienna of an Hysterical Scene at the Court of Serbia.

Vienna, Nov. 20.—An unconfirmed report reached Vienna that Queen Draga has been shot in the streets of Belgrade. The Neue Presse and other Vienna papers publish various rumors, one declaring that the Serbian Queen was assassinated, another that she was wounded and a third that she committed suicide. Reports from other sources deny the statement that Queen Draga was killed and assert that the rumor of her death was caused by a hysterical scene with King Alexander.

There is no reliable information on the subject here, but it is generally believed that a serious crisis exists in Belgrade.

Paris, Nov. 21.—According to a despatch from Vienna to The Echo de Paris, an attempt has been made to assassinate the Queen of Serbia, three shots having been fired at her while she was driving near Somin.

A despatch to the same paper from Belgrade gives a rumor that the Queen attempted suicide at Somin.

John Davidson, of Thamesville, ex-Warden of Kent County, and one of the most popular of men, was chosen as standard bearer for the Liberal-Conservative party at the convention held in Ridgetown today. The Convention was very enthusiastic, and the largest in the history of the riding of East Kent. Only two names were nominated, ex-Warden Davidson and Philip Bowyer, editor and proprietor of the Ridgetown Dominion.

The first vote stood—Davidson 76, Bowyer 68. Mr. Bowyer at once moved that Mr. Davidson be made the unanimous choice of the convention. This was done amid enthusiastic cheers.

Speeches were then delivered by the candidate, and by James Clancy, M. P., John Frazer, candidate for West Kent, Findlay McDiarmid and others.

Harmony and enthusiasm characterized the convention.

Warden Davidson is well known in the county. He served for several years in the County Council and was Warden in 1900. His upright manly character has won for him the respect of all and no more popular candidate could have been chosen.

FOUND DEAD IN THE BARN.

Alexandria, Nov. 20.—Dougal Cameron, aged 25 years, was found dead on his father's barn floor at noon today. Cause of death unknown. An inquest will be held.

WANTED TO BE HANGED APART.

Harrisburg, Pa., Nov. 18.—Council for Edward and Thos. Biddle, the Amherstburg men, under sentence of death at Pittsburg, has requested Gov. Stone to fix separate days for their execution. The Biddies, who are brothers, do not want to be hanged from the same scaffold on the same day. The day of their execution has not yet been fixed.

The Biddies, together with Walter Dorman, were convicted of the murder of Thos. Kahany while attempting to burglarize his home at Pittsburg. Dorman turned State's evidence and may, for that reason, escape the gallows. He has not been sentenced yet.

When officers went to Ed. Biddle's room to arrest him he made a desperate resistance. During the fight Detective P. J. Fitzgerald was shot and killed.
