II. ENGLAND.

In England there are 36 County and District Associations, sometimes called Unions, 2,013 churches, 119 branch churches, 1,004 preaching stations, and 78 evangelists' stations. Of these churches 8 are returned as having lay pastors, 136 are variously supplied, and 231 are vacant. There are 2,119 ministers (including some in Wales), of which number 1,609 are settled pastors, and 510 are without churches. No statistics of membership are given in the English returns.
