R. HONEY'S HOLSTEINS, COTSWOLDS, AND YORKSHIRES.

The hundred-acre farm of Mr. R. Honey, at Brinkley, Ont., is situated some four and a half miles from the Village of Warkworth, in East Northumberland Co., and six miles from Hastings station on the Peterborough and Belleville branch of the G. T. R. The Holstein herd this year contains the foundation cow Minister Maid 771, by Woodland Prince 348, and out of Miss Staple 728. She is now six years old; a large-sized, evenly-made cow, that has not only proved herself a regular breeder but a dairy cow of high order, persistently being her stronghold. Under private test, Mr. Honey informs us that she recorded 63 lbs. of 4.2% milk in one day. She has raised three females and a bull on the farm, the latter going to a Quebec buyer, the females remaining in the herd. Her three-year-old daughter, Rose of Minister 1507, by Spring Valley Prince 8679, resembles her dam in conformation, and promises to equal it, not surpassing her as a producer, having already reached the 50 lb. mark on dry feed; her last calf (a straight, strong heifer) is now on the farm. The yearling heifer Laura, by Duke of Streetsville 988 and out of the old cow, although but 15 mos., is credited with a splendid young heifer calf to the present stock bull, and from the manner in which she is feeding it she certainly possesses the necessary qualities to stamp her as a dairy cow. Queen of Minister, by Duke of Streetsville and out of Minister Maid, is a well-developed six-months heifer. The present stock bull, Netherland Tiranla Baron 1162, by Netherland Castine King 466 and out of Jonyste Aggie's Tiranla Queen 697, was calved October 28th, 1898, and purchased from Messrs. Smith Bros., Churchville. We saw him a year ago and consider he did one well done job on the farm. His excellent breeding will undoubtedly make a good impression in herd.

A Cotswold flock of some 30 animals was next visited, and we found 11 strong, well-covered breeding ewes raising lambs, as well as half a dozen good shearlings. The foundation was obtained from Mr. Thompson, Uxbridge, and are a pair of very good, well-covered rams, a shearing and a two shear. Stock rams have been obtained from Mr. Garbut, Claremont. This crop of lambs is a good, strong, well-covered lot, five of which are rams and are held for sale, and some good individuals are among them, and all registered.

At the head of the Yorkshire herd is the stock boar Bluchet 2620, by Jock 2064 and out of Lady Nora 2676. He is a strong, smoothly made yearling that is proving himself a satisfactory sire. Among the females we saw the three-year-old sow Blenheim 2188, by Holywell Hastings 571 and out of Lady Percy 918, with her seventh litter at foot. She has been, and is to-day, a good animal of the deep-sided, bacon type, with her flesh well distributed.

Rose 2391, by Bismarck 2162 and out of Blenheim, is a year old and due in July, raising a litter of twelve in the spring, only one of which (a young boar) is left. Two other sows due the latter part of the summer, also a very choice six-months sow qualified for the showing, having good length and depth, with her substance evenly distributed, were seen. Mr. Honey reports the demand good for Yorkshires; and many enquiries were received which were effectual in disposing of all the surplus stock. He will also be in good shape again this fall to meet the big demand which at present exists for this class of stock.

F. W. TAYLOR'S AYRSHIRES.

A short run over Mr. Taylor's farm, near Wellman's Corners, brought us to view the Ayshire herd, in its fine form as we ever saw them and at present containing some finely-bred, strongly-constituted young female and bull calves. The stock bull, Douglas of London 1384, by Royal Chief (imp.) 75 and out of Dandy 1st (imp.), is now in his sixth year, and each crop of calves from him raises him a notch in the estimation of his owner. He is himself kept in good, strong, serviceable form, though we saw some grand forms and udders, Rosalie 1888, by Sir Colon 301 and out of Beauty 1335, with pedigree running to imp. Red Rose 66, is credited with some good individuals, any of which that were exposed for sale finding ready buyers. Flora 1884, by Sam Jones 1197 and out of Lady Jane 1883, is also regarded as one of the founders of the herd; and some good females possessing the highest dairy qualities trace their origin to her. Her four-year-old daughter White Rose, and Primrose, the two-year-old, being worthy of special notice. Helen Maid 2265, by Thomas H. and out of Rosalie, is a grand young cow, just in her prime, smoothly made on strict dairy principles, and a grand producer. Her two-year-old daughter, Annie Laurie, promises well, being supplied with a nicely-made udder of sufficient size to stamp her as a producer of high order; many good ones. One remarkable feature of this herd is their remarkable evenness in quality, and, apparently, their productiveness is the first consideration with Mr. Taylor. The young season's demands has reduced the young females lower than the yearlings of the herd has been for some time. We saw shown five bull calves by Douglas, which are a good thrifty, smooth lot, having straight backs and deep bodies, with plenty of length and all of a beautiful light color with characteristic red markings.
