Be it enacted, by the governor, council and assembly, as follows:

1. Nathan Tupper, John M. Caldwell, James E. Beckwith, Name of con-David Chipman, William Roberson, junior, and such other per-pany. sons as are now or shall become proprietors of shares in the corporation hereby established, their successors and assigns, are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "the Cornwallis steam saw mill and maufacturing company."

2. The capital of the company shall be ten thousand pounds, to Capital-shares be divided into shares of ten pounds each; and the company shall —real estate. not at any time hold real estate of greater value than five thousand pounds.

3. No member of the corporation shall be liable for the debts of Liability of the company in his person or separate estate, for a greater amount members. in the whole, than double the amount of the stock held by him, deducting therefrom the amount actually paid to the company on account thereof, unless he shall have rendered himself liable for a greater amount by becoming surety for the debts of the company.
