ventaire, shall continue and be in force, until the meeting of the said Court, and subject to a determination thereupon in the said Court, touching the right of such Bénésice d'Inventaire, without any appeal therefrom having an effect to sufpend such Judgement.

Upon motion of Mr. Berthelot, seconded by Mr. Tellier,

RESOLVED, That this House do now resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, to take the said amendments into consideration.

Accordingly the House resolved itself into the said Committee,

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Taschereau took the Chair of the Committee;

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair,

And Mr. Taschereau reported, that the Committee had gone through the faid amendments and had come to feveral Resolutions thereon, which he was directed to Report to the House; and he read the Report in his place, and afterwards delivered the same, with the Bill, in at the Table, where it was again read by the Clerk.

The said Resolutions are as follows:

RESOLVED, that it is the opinion of this Committee, that the first amendment of the Legislative Council to the Bill be rejected.

RESOLVED, that it is the opinion of this Committee, that the second amendment of the Legislative Council to the Bill be rejected.
