nor more than fifteen days preceding the first day, on which such election was to be held, but on the contrary, gave only, one day's notice thereof, within the parishes of Saint Fosepb and Saint François, the former being the place of election as aforesaid, and the latter, diltant therefrom four leagues; by which means, upwards of one thousand electors of and in the faid County of Dorchester, have been deprived of their undoubted and inestimable right of voting at the election of Members, to represent them in the present Provincial Parliament. poll was opened at the request of the said Candidates, on the said twenty-third day of October, now last past, at the parish of Saint Foseph. Nouvelle Beauce, and was afterwards closed on the same day, by the faid Fean Bte. Demers, during the temporary absence of the said petitioner, John Caldwell, without his consent, or the consent of any perfon or persons authorised to represent him, and without having held the faid poll open eight hours, at the least, between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning, and fix o'clock in the evening, as by Law required.—And the faid petitioners further represent, that the petitioner, John Caldwell, on the said twenty third of October last. finding but few persons at the place of election, and that those few had given their votes, demanded an adjournment of the poil to the fecond place of election, to wit, at Point Levi, which was refused him; and it was then agreed by and between the faid Jean Thomas Taschereau, Pierre Langlois, and the petitioner, John Caldwell, in the presence of the said Fean Baptiste Demers, that the said poll should be held open until fix o'clock in the evening, of the faid twenty third day of October, and during the three ensuing days, as by law directed, previous to the faid poll being opened at the second place of election. to wit, at Point Levi; nevertheless that the said poll was closed as aforesaid, during the temporary absence of the said John Caldwell, without his consent, or the consent of any person authorised to reprefent him, before the hour of fix o'clock in the evening, of the fame day, to wit: about the hour of two in the afternoon, and the faid Fean Thomas Taschereau and Pierre Langlois, were proclaimed duly elected. That the laid petitioners humbly conceive, that the electon of the faid Jean Thomas Taschereau and Pierre Langlois, for the causes. aforesaid, is null and void. --- Wherefore the said petitioners hun, bly pray, that the Houle may be pleafed to take their prefent petition into imme-
