With a Meffage, defiring the Concurrence of this Houle to the fame. And the faid Bill was read a 1st Time.

Ordered, That it be read a 2d Time.

The Houfe having taken into Confideration the effential Services rendered the Province by the fpirited Exertions of his Majefty's Troops, particularly in quelling the late Infurrection at *Cumberland*, and the Alacrity the Officers and Soldiers have on all Occafions fhewn in doing their Duty, fo intirely to the Satisfaction of the Inhabitants.

Refolved, That the Thanks of this Houfe be prefented to Major General Maffey, Commander in Chief of his Majefty's Troops in this Province, for his conftant and generous Attention to its Safety and Protection.

Ordered, That Colonel Tonge, John Newton, Efq; and Mr. Solicitor General do prefent the fame.

The Houfe having alfo taken into Confideration the effential Services rendered the Province by the fpirited Exertions of the Officers and Seamen of his Majefty's Ships, particularly in quelling the late Infurrection at *Cumberland*, and the Alacrity they have on all Occafions fhewn in doing their Duty, fo entirely to the Satisfaction of the Inhabitants,

Refolved, That the Thanks of this House be presented to Sir George Collier, Commander of his Majesty's Ships in this Province for his constant and generous Attention to its Safety and Protection.

Ordered, That Colonel Tonge, John Newton, Efq; and Mr. Solicitor General do prefent the fame.

Notice being taken that in the Accounts for Expences, relating to the Militia and in the Account for Contingencies, there are feveral improper Charges, and a Motion being made, that a Committee be appointed to examine into the fame.

Ordered, That Mr. Prince, Mr. Chipman, and Mr. Lovett, be a Committee for that Purpofe, and they are to call before them fuch Perfons as may be neceffary to explain, or give Evidence relative thereto.

Mr. Secretary of the Province laid before the Houfe, by Order of his Honor the Lieutenant Governor, an Estimate for the Expences of Government for one Year commencing the 1st of January, 1778.

And the fame was read,

Ordered, That it it be read again on Thursday next.

Then the Houfe adjourned till To-morrow Morning 9 o'Clock.
