made to the Proprietor or Tenant, until the Lands shall have been actually taken possession of, for the said Highway.

VIII. And whereas lines of Road through Wilderness Lands, are often of great benefit to the Lands, through which the same do pass, and tend to increase greatly the value of such Lands, and it is but just and reasonable that the Proprietors thereof should contribute to the formation of such Roads: Be it therefore On lines of Road enacted by the authority aforesaid, That when being opened through Wilderand so often as the Lieutenant Governor for the ness Lands, Lt. time being, by and with the advice of Her Governor by advice of Coun-Majesty's Council, shall deem it necessary to cil, to issue Writ, cause Roads to be opened through unsettled within Ten days' Lands, it shall and may be lawful for him to thereof, to give order a Writ to be issued and the said Sheriff, Notice to parties interested, by Coroner, or other Officer to whom such Writ posting Notices shall be directed, shall and he is hereby required public places, and to give Notice thereof, to all parties interested cause the same to within Ten days after he shall receive any such Royal Gazate, Writ, by causing Notices to be posted up at 4 successive three or more of the most public places, in or nearest to the District, through which the new Road is to pass, and shall also cause the same to be inserted in the Royal Gazette Newspaper, printed in Charlottetown, for at least four successive Weeks immediately next before the time of executing the said Writ, and which Notices shall be respectively in the following form, and shall be deemed and taken, to be sufficient Notice, to all persons interested in the execution of such Writ, anything to the contrary notwithstanding (that is to say.)
