THE DELTA FAIR.
The weather—a good fortune and an auspicious omen to the fair.
A Reporter representative visited the Delta fair on Thursday, the 26th day of the exhibition. The R. & W. had a good crowd from Brockville, Lytt and Athens. On enquiry we learned that the number who took in the exhibition on Wednesday and Thursday, was very small. A heavy rain throughout the building and grounds convinced us that while the animals and articles were on the whole better than last season the number of exhibitors was unusually low. The cattle stalls were well filled with a fine class of cattle. The centre of attraction in the cattle class was the Jersey, which from rumors made by spectators was universally expected, to be the cow of the future. Albert D. DeLong, of Elgin, had two cows 3 years old and a bull calf which took the highest honors in the class. The cat was exhibited in the poultry exhibit. Mr. DeLong paid a handsome price of a few weeks ago. He is a hearty and determined to make a good record not only in the year but at exhibitions as well. Israel Stevens of Delta was also an exhibitor, in this class, showing some very fine animals which he claims are 11-16 Jersey. There was a fair show of sheep. The Downs were the favorite, E. G. Murphy, Elgin, carrying off nearly all the best honors in this class. Swine was not largely represented, the Yorkshire exhibited by E. G. Murphy drawing the most attention. The poultry exhibit was small, Clifford Kester of Greenbush being the principal exhibitor. In the balls the show of domestic manufactures was smaller than usual. The grains and roots were fine in quality but small in quantity. The display of butter, cheese, honey etc., was fair. Apples, grapes and vegetables were good. The directors had a small room partitioned off from the main room for the purpose of exhibiting the special prizes given by friends of the society. The "white plus" given by Collins was placed on the head of the good looking drover from Newboro, and he was the one that created a very favorable impression on the minds of some of the ladies, who had come quite a distance expecting to see this fat on the head of Brockville's chief competitor. Some of the knowing ones pointed out the genial Billy to a certain lady in the crowd as his honor, but she smilingly replied that she could not be fooled that way, as she had seen the Mayor's footprints in the snow on a certain memorable occasion when he assisted to break a track for a R. & W. engine on the road near Lya. This hat was subsequently worn by the drover's poster, who with a feeling of liberality donated it to a leading sport at the fair. Strange to relate this same hat was found in the Athens fair stable the next morning, where it was given a peg in the bottom of a manure bin. In the horse ring the show was good, some very fine animals being exhibited, but the quantity of quality could in no way compare with the Athens fair. The race attracted considerable attention. The winner of the first day was J. C. Rydyk, with Prince second. The three minute race failed to materialize on the second day. The following horses were entered for the free-for-all: Frank L. Billy Johnston, Belle Wilson, and Nettie O. Frank L. took three straight heats, the others came in a place behind. The official time given by Mr. E. B. Algrave was 48, 48 and 47. Those who claim to know say the track is nearly 14 rods over a mile in three circuits. The entire number of 184 and the gate receipts over \$600. Everything on the grounds was conducted in first-class order and every person holding any position of trust was doing and seeing to the satisfaction of all visitors. The R. & W. arranged everything to accommodate passengers, with the facilities at their disposal, and everybody seemed satisfied with the accommodation. On the return trip, the regular train from Brockville crossed the excursion train at Lyttahurst crossing, the ex-train being backed down into the gravel pit. This track had not been used for some months and was partially overgrown with grass and weeds. This rendered the brakes useless and the rear car plunged into a sand bank, from which it took all hands nearly half an hour to extricate the train.

FAIR NOTES—Continued.
The firm of Gordon & Halladay, woolen manufacturers, Athens, made a very creditable display of cloth, slacks, yarns etc. This firm has made wonderful progress in the manufacture of all kinds of woolen goods during the past two years and are now able to compete with any of the large factories in their line.
That veteran exhibitor, Wm. Panneck of Elgin, carried off the honor of taking more prizes than any other exhibitor. He received 37 first, 5 second and 5 third prize tickets and he makes the boast that he does not need to bring old stuff to capture prizes as every article was the product or manufacture of 1890.
Geo. F. McNish of Lya agricultural works had a novelty in the exhibition line on exhibition. It is designed for working in corn, potatoes and roots, and is especially adapted for working among strawberry vines. The hose are hung on swivels so as to be raised single or together over obstructions or for turning around at the end of the rows and transported from one place to the other. He also exhibited a shovel plow for killing root crops, which combined strength, lightness of draft and handling and also light in price.
Thos. Davison of Spring Valley, was to the front with his fine herd of Holsteins. He captured 6 first prizes in the different sections.
John M. Keator of Greenbush, was a large exhibitor of cattle, Jersey cattle, swine and poultry. He took 1st on 3 year old cow in harness, 1st on Jersey bull, 1st on Berkshire boar, and 11 prizes on poultry.
Murray & Son, Brockville, made a very fine exhibit of oil paintings.
Although there was keen competition they succeeded in carrying off five first prizes and one second.
John McArthur, Brockville, Assessor's assistant as an exhibitor of fowl. He had a large collection of choice animals and took 11 first, 2 second and 3 third prizes.
Jas. Neilson, Lya, was a large exhibitor of sheep and got 5 first, and 2 second prizes on Oxford Down.
