

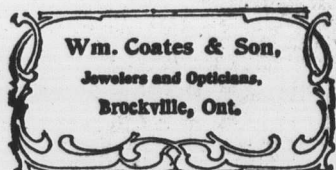

That "Truth is mighty and must prevail" was forcibly demonstrated in a debate held in form 3A in the A.H.S. on Monday afternoon. Subject—Truth vs. Tact.
