

By-Law No

By-Law to authorize aid by the City of Chatham, for the promotion of a factory in the said City, for the manufacture of bolts, nuts, manure spreaders, gasoline and wind engines for farm and other purposes and other lines of manufactured products, and to provide for the issue of debentures of the said City to the amount of \$20,000.00, and to raise the sum required therefor.

Provisionally Adopted the 28th day of November, A. D. 1904.

Finally Passed

WHEREAS, it is proposed by Geo. H. Jaquin, W. S. Marshall and others, to incorporate under the name of the "Defiance Iron Works Company, Limited," to build, equip and operate a factory in the said City of Chatham, for the manufacture of bolts, nuts, manure spreaders, gasoline and wind engines for farm and other purposes, and other lines of manufactured products.

AND WHEREAS the said Council is desirous of granting aid for the promotion of such manufacture, by way of a loan of \$20,000 to the said Company, to be advanced upon the completion of the building and equipment of the said factory, and forthwith after the beginning of operations thereon to its capacity as hereinafter provided (to be repaid in fifteen equal annual consecutive instalments of principal and interest which shall be computed at 3 per centum per annum) such payments of principal and interest being so calculated that the amount payable in each year shall be as nearly as possible equal, with the privilege to the said Company of paying off the whole principal sum at any time, and at the free supply of water from the Chatham Water Works for the said factory, (not to exceed, however, at any time 3,500 gallons per day) for the period of fifteen years, and exempted from the time of the first use of such water for building or for manufacture hereunder, and exemption from taxation other than school taxes and frontage rates of all the property occupied by and used in connection with the said factory or the business carried on therein for the period of ten years from and after the first day of January, 1905, and the placing of such water mains and hydrants as will insure prompt and adequate fire protection to the said buildings upon the following terms and conditions:—

1. THAT the said The Defiance Iron Works Company, Limited, shall purchase and build a site for and build and equip in the said City of Chatham, during the years 1905 and 1906, a factory and plant with suitable machinery for the manufacture of bolts, nuts, manure spreaders, gasoline and wind engines for farm and other purposes, and other lines of manufactured products.

2. THAT the said Company will expend in acquiring a site for the said factory and in building the same and other buildings and warehouses in connection therewith and in equipping the said factory not less than \$25,000.00, and so that the same when completed shall be worth not less than the said sum.

3. THAT the said Company will, continuously, during the whole of said fifteen years employ in and about the said factory at least fifty men and shall pay annually in wages to its employees (including Office boys of the said Joint Stock Company) not less than \$20,000.00 provided, however, that this condition shall not be binding upon the said Company should it be, against, or contrary to the will of its officers or directors, stopped or prevented from running by reason of strikes or other conditions not caused or contributed to by the said Company.

4. THAT the said Company shall have an authorized capital of at least \$50,000.00, of which not less than \$10,000.00 shall be subscribed and not less than \$20,000.00 shall be fully paid up.

5. THAT the repayment of the said loan of \$20,000.00 shall be secured by a first mortgage upon all the property, machinery and plant of the said Company in the said City of Chatham, and said Company shall contain in the statutory powers, covenants and conditions and shall provide for the insurance of the property against fire in favor of the corporation of the City of Chatham to the full amount of the said mortgage and shall be satisfactory in form to the said Council, and shall also contain the personal covenant of the Directors of the said Company for the payment of the first instalment payable under the said mortgage.

6. THAT should the said Company fail or omit to perform and comply with any of the terms or conditions above set forth, at any time or times during the currency of the said mortgage, the said sum of \$20,000.00 or so much thereof as may be unpaid at the time or times of such failure of performance shall, upon demand in writing being made therefor, by or on behalf of the said Corporation or Council, at any time or times thereafter specifying the non-performance, become immediately due and payable by the said Company to the said Corporation, and upon the same or any similar event at any time or times thereafter the said Corporation or Council may, by giving notice in writing, terminate the period during which the said property shall be exempt from taxation and such exemption shall thereupon cease and said property shall forthwith become liable for taxes and upon the same or any similar event, at any time or times thereafter, the said Corporation or Council may completely stop the said free supply of water.

7. THAT the said Company shall

at all times until the said sum of \$20,000.00 and interest shall have been repaid, permit full and free inspection of its premises and pay rolls by any person or persons appointed for that purpose by the Council of the said Corporation.

AND WHEREAS it is desired to authorize the entering into an agreement on the part of the Corporation with the said Company, providing for the giving of the said aid upon the terms and conditions above set forth, AND WHEREAS in order to carry out such agreement it will be necessary to issue debentures of the said Corporation for the sum of \$20,000.00 as hereinafter provided (which is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this by-law), the proceeds of the said debentures to be applied to the purpose aforesaid and no other.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to issue the said debentures at one time and to take the principal of the said debt repayable by yearly sums during the period of fifteen years, being the currency of the said debentures, said yearly sums being of such respective amounts that the aggregate amount payable in each year for principal and interest in respect of said debt shall be as nearly as possible equal to the amount so payable in each of the other fourteen years of said period.

AND WHEREAS the total amount required by "The Municipal Act," to be raised annually by special rate for paying the said debt and interest as hereinafter provided is \$1,862.27 for the said sum of \$20,000.00, the amount of the whole rateable property of the City of Chatham, according to the last revised assessment roll thereof, is \$3,834,057.00:

AND WHEREAS the amount of the said debt and interest of \$1,862.27 exclusive of local improvement rates or special tax rates and assessments, no part whereof is in arrears:

There, the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the City of Chatham enacts as follows:—

1. The Municipal Council of the said City shall grant aid for the promotion of the said manufacture of the said Company, and upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, and the Mayor and Clerk of the said Corporation are hereby authorized to execute an agreement on the part of the said Corporation, binding the Corporation upon the said terms and conditions, to give such aid.

2. That for the purpose of raising the said sum of \$20,000.00 debentures of the said Corporation to the amount of \$20,000.00, and interest thereon of not less than \$100 each may be issued on the 2nd day of October, 1905, each of which debentures shall be dated on the date of issue thereof, and shall be payable within fifteen years thereafter at the Standard Bank or Canada in the said City of Chatham.

3. Each of the said debentures shall be signed by the Mayor of the said City of Chatham, and by some other person authorized by-law to sign the same, and by the Treasurer thereof of the said City of Chatham, and the Clerk shall attach thereto the Corporate Seal of the said Corporation.

4. The said debentures shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per centum per annum, payable yearly, and shall be payable in such amounts and at such times that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any year in respect of the debt shall be equal as nearly as may be to what is payable for principal and interest during each of the other fourteen years of said period.

5. During the currency of said debentures, there shall be raised annually by special rate on all the rateable property in the said City of Chatham the sum of \$1,862.27 for the purpose of paying the amount due in each of the said years for principal and interest in respect of the said debt.

6. This By-law shall take effect on the final passing thereof.

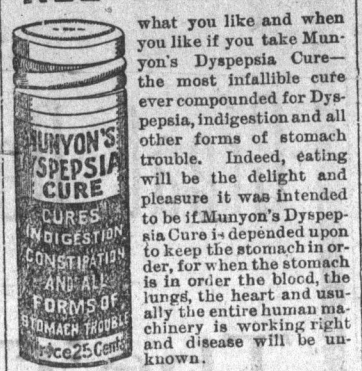

ARCHIE VANESS KILLED

Rifle Shot Fired By His Father's Hand While Hunting.

Bullet First Passed Through James Parks, Another Young Member of the Party—The Young Men Had Left Their Cover On the Runway and the Lad's Father Mistook Son's Hat For the Tail of a Deer.

Kingston, Dec. 7.—Another terrible hunting tragedy occurred on Saturday at Beaver Creek, Kennebec Township, County of Frontenac, resulting in the death of Archie Vaness by rifle shot fired by his father's hand, the bullet also dangerously wounding James Parks, another young member of the party. On that day Henry Vaness and his son Archie, Peter Vaness, an uncle of Henry, Walter Parks and his son James went out to hunt deer.

At a runway they divided, the two young men taking cover and the others retiring some distance. Unfortunately the young men left their cover and in the uncertain light Henry Vaness mistook for a tail of a light colored soft hat for the tail of a deer. He fired and the shot followed by a scream of agony. Hurrying to the spot he was agitated to find his son stone dead and James Parks writhing in the ground. After passing through James Parks, after passing through James Parks, who was in front, pierced the heart of Archie Vaness who cried "Oh, my lord" three times and then was silent.

Terrible Journey Home. The distracted father picked up his son's body, and taking James Parks by the hand, trudged slowly homewards. Parks was left at a neighbor's house, and another two miles and a half was traversed before Vaness reached his own house with his terrible burden. Yesterday Parks rested quietly, and his doctor thinks he will recover. He says he could see Henry Vaness raising his gun to fire, but thought it was at a deer.

Child Shot in the Head. Toronto, Dec. 7.—Rita Curry, aged five years, is lying at the home of her parents, 26 St. Andrew's street, in a critical condition, as the result of a bullet wound in the head. Miss Edythe Trowbridge of Toronto, was hurled from the touring car and her ankle was badly sprained. With the exception of a few bruises, Miss Isabel received severe injuries. Gerald Myles, being doubtful, the car was making fast time, and while attempting to turn a corner, Mr. Myles failed, causing the machine to leave the road, from which it was later rescued by a steamer.

Lost in the English Channel. Calais, Dec. 7.—The French bark Madeline, from Chile for Dunkirk, has been lost in the channel. Her crew of fifteen men took to the boats from which they were later rescued by a steamer.
