by the Government to aid the investigation. If he, the chairman, attempted to interfere, he would be interfering with the Government. He would not be referred to in the House, when it was said it would be on the lines of the state investigation in New York. On the grounds that Mr. Shepley has the conduct of the inquiry we will not interfere with his conduct.

The entire morning was taken up with the evidence of Mr. J. F. Junkin, managing director of the Manufacturers' Life Insurance Co., who described the old company from Mr. George Gooderham to Hon. George A. Cox. The control of the company remained in Mr. Cox's hands only a short time. The withdrawal of the right of policyholders to vote by proxy which existed in one of the former companies was shown to be withdrawn in the new company.

Mr. Junkin could give little information as to the agreement between Mr. Cox and Mr. Gooderham regarding the transfer of the control of the Manufacturers' Life.

An agreement was also produced showing that \$10,000 was promised to be paid to Henry Sutherland, managing director of the Temperance & General Co., who retired when the company amalgamated with the Manufacturers' Life. The amount was to be paid in five annual instalments of \$2,000 each, and Mr. Sutherland was bound not to disturb the business of any of the parties.

On the commencement of the afternoon session Mr. Junkin, for half an hour, corrected incorrect testimony given in the morning.

A Moral Dividend. The attention of the commission was drawn to the fact that immediately on the formation of the new company in July, 1901, a dividend of 4 per cent. had been declared for the first half of the year 1901. The declaration was made on the list of shareholders as it stood in 1901.
