In making an ascension in a balloon at Brockville, Ont., on the 1st inst., Prof. Squires, the aeronaut, had a very narrow escape. The excitement was intense—the ten thousand spectators holding their breath, expecting every second to see the man lose his hold and be killed. A young man gained access to the steeple, and passed a plank out of a hole in it—about five feet from the basket of the balloon. Telling a man inside to hold the plank steady, the aeronaut stepped out and told the new alms most powerless aeronaut to have courage, at the same time steadying the basket so as to allow him to relax his hold on the rope. In the meantime another brave fellow had reached a hole in the steeple, just above the balloon's head, and reaching out, succeeded in catching him by the arm and hoisting him in, amid the deafening cheers of the multitude.
