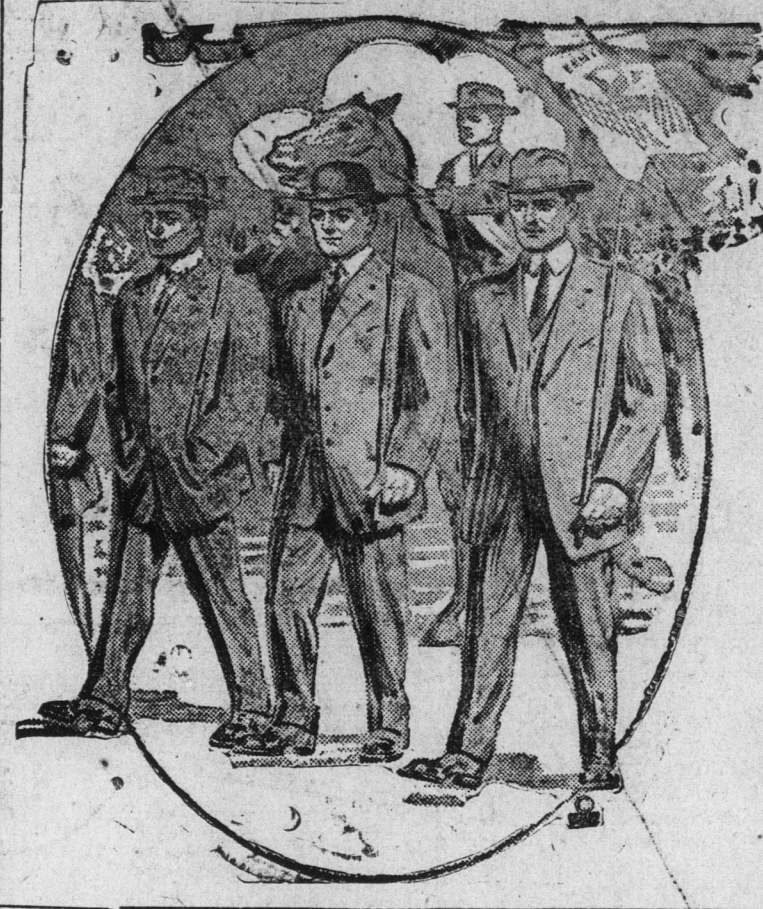

At the City Hall.

The regular weekly meeting of the City Commission was held on Thursday afternoon, the following being present:—

The Chairman, Messrs. Harris, McNamara, Ayre, Bradshaw, Mullaly, McGrath, Morris, Anderson and Withers.

A letter from the Colonial Secretary, stating that arrangements had been made for the Board to draw on the Royal Bank for the money for water extension, was read.

The Government Engineer again wrote on the matter of the line on Cornwall Avenue for the erection

of poles for the Postal Telegraphs. It was decided that the Board cannot grant a permit for a permanent line.

A letter from J. P. Blackwood re the McLaughlin property on LeMarchant Road, was read. The matter was deferred until the records are examined.

H. R. Cook quoted prices for fencing on Parade Street. The matter was deferred.

R. Holland's communication re the tables on Freshwater and Pennywell Roads was read, and the matter was referred to the Health Officer for report.

John Beer complained of lack of

water main on Cockstown Road. The service will be extended next week.

H. Bursell applied for permission to make repairs to house, No. 57 Water Street West. The Solicitor will be asked if the Board has power to grant permit.

The British Society asked permission to install a moving picture machine at their hall. Permission was granted, and the Inspector General will be informed of the same.

Permission to repair house was granted to W. Clancy, Prescott St. Tenders will be asked for material for the water works.

In relation to the recent purchase of water pipes the Chairman submitted the following

STATEMENT.

On January 28th letters were sent to Hazen & Whipple, New York, and to McLaren & Co., Glasgow, asking for quotations by wire on cast iron water pipe. The replies were \$22.75 per ton from Hazen & Whipple and about \$36.00 per ton from McLaren. Hazen & Whipple wrote that they had obtained quotations from U. S. Cast Iron Pipe Co., and thought that the R. D. Wood Co., of Philadelphia could also give favourable quotations. The Board could not close at that time as the borrowing of the money had not been arranged for. On March 8th Hazen & Whipple telegraphed that owing to advance in freight the quotation was then \$23.20 and on March 13th they wired that a better freight rate had been obtained and that the quotation was then \$22.90.

In the meanwhile it was discovered that Mr. O'Driscoll was the local agent of the U. S. Cast Iron Pipe Co., and it was unanimously agreed that if he could do as well, the business would be put through him. This might not seem fair to Hazen & Whipple but

it was surmised, correctly as it turned out, that it would make no difference to Hazen & Whipple, that the City would have to pay them for their services in any case; Hazen & Whipple were engineers and not agents for Pipe Companies, and in this matter were acting as the agents for the City.

On March 15th Mr. O'Driscoll obtained the same price which had previously been submitted through Hazen & Whipple of \$22.90. On March 18th Hazen and Whipple telegraphed that they had obtained an unusually favourable offer from R. D. Wood Co., of \$20.50 for 20 inch pipe which worked out at about \$6,000 under the price from the U. S. Cast Iron Pipe Co.

The Board had not yet received the permission of the Government to proceed in the purchase of the pipe, and Mr. O'Driscoll on March 19th, was informed that his tender was too high.

On March 22nd Hazen and Whipple telegraphed that R. D. Wood Co. had made a mistake between St. John, N. B., and St. John's, Nfld., and that the prices should be \$22.00 for 20 inch pipe, \$22.50 for 16 to 12 inches, and

\$23.00 for 8 to 6 inches. Less \$1 per ton for any pipe then in stock.

Mr. O'Driscoll in the meanwhile, March 25th, had received a telegram repeating the price of \$22.90 and asking for counter offer. The guarantee of the Government having been received on Saturday last, at 12 o'clock Messrs. Harris and Ayre and myself met to decide on the matter. The R. D. Wood Company's offer was open for one week, which was then up, and the pipe ex-stock at \$1.00 reduction was only subject to not being sold in the meanwhile. It was therefore not possible to make a counter offer to Mr. O'Driscoll which action would not have been fair in any case.

There was one other consideration beside the price—April and September shipments, were offered by the Wood Co. The offer received by Mr. O'Driscoll was for June and July, which was not so suitable. The U. S. Pipe Co., have, however, quoted September shipments to Hazen and Whipple at 40 cents over June.

The amount of pipe required was roughly 980 tons for April shipment and 1,050 tons for September, of which about 1,700 tons were 20 inch pipe. The difference in the total cost of the two quotations was about \$2,220 in favour of the Wood Co.

If the only offer for September shipment from the U. S. Cast Iron Pipe Co., was figured on, the difference would be \$430 more or \$2,650.00 in favour of the Wood Co. The order was consequently given to the Wood Company.

During the afternoon a letter was received from Mr. O'Driscoll saying that the U. S. Cast Iron Pipe Co., reduced their offer 45 cents. Even if this offer had not been received too late, it would still have left a difference in favour of the Wood Co., of \$1,200.00 assuming that the U. S. Pipe Company's September price was \$23.90.

In addition to this order, the Board require about 5,000 feet of 6 inch pipe to complete the work undertaken last year, and it was thought desirable to get it here as early as possible, so that employment could be given to as many men as possible before the larger work was begun.

Mr. O'Driscoll was asked to quote, and submitted offer of \$27.50 which was accepted for shipment by Stephano April 12th. This was \$4.50 per ton over Woods quotation, and the quantity came to about 80 tons, making a difference of \$360.00 but as it would arrive here we thought about a month before Wood shipment, we gave the order to Mr. O'Driscoll. Days Past—82 To Come—272
WASHINGTON IRVING born 1783. The first American author who obtained a European reputation purely as a man of letters. Among his best works are "The Sketch Book," "Rip Van Winkle," "The Alhambra."

MARILLO died 1882, aged 65. Great Spanish painter, whose chief works are after-pieces and religious subjects. He also painted a number of marvellous studies of peasant life.

JOHANNES BRAHMS died 1897, aged 64. German musical composer of deserved eminence. His compositions are of a varied order, most classical in form and possess deep intensity of expression and poetic significance. The three great periods of musical history are the three B's—Bach—Beethoven—Brahms.

DEATH OF PRINCE ARTHUR 1203. Henry II. of England, left five sons William, Henry, Richard, Geoffrey and John. Arthur was Geoffrey's son and was the next heir to the throne in 1216 but his uncle John seized the throne and imprisoned Arthur. He was either murdered by order of John or killed in attempting to escape from a castle. Shakespeare adopts the latter view.

OLIVER GOLDSMITH died 1774, aged 46. British author. Wrote "The Vicar of Wakefield," "The Traveller," and the great poem "The Deserted Village," etc. His chequered life is shown up in the events of the first two mentioned.

HANS RICHTER born 1843. Great Hungarian conductor, sometime Wagner's chief assistant. His extraordinary memory enabled him to conduct the longest works without the score.
