**Largest Doors on Earth.**

The doors in question are those at the west entrance of St. Paul's Cathedral, London, England, and the reason they are not noticed more than they are is that, except in the hot summer weather, they are nearly always closed. There may be larger doors, but not all in one piece like these. Each of the two leaves is of solid oak, they stand about thirty feet high, and their weight is enormous. They are built without a nail, the various cross-pieces and panels being held together by means of bronze bolts, which bosses at each side. The doors are nearly as old as the cathedral itself, and have upon them the initials of the carpenter who made them. The hinges are, of course, immensely massive, the main pairs at top and bottom being deeply sunk into the solid Portland stone of which the great structure is built. These doors are only opened on State occasions, such as a visit by the King or the Lord Mayor. On one occasion when a gate from the west was blowing up Ludgate Hill, it took a squad of twenty policemen to force the great leaves back into place against the pressure of the wind.
