The report of the Road Commission was presented by Mr.T. Soper, who announced that the work of repairing the Portugal Cove Road had been commenced and it was hoped that the representatives for St. John's East would make an allocation of \$1000 so that the road near Windsor Lake could be widened. Mr. Soper further stated that to date 503 cars had registered, and the taxes colected amounted to \$16,500 of which the Commission would receive \$8,250. There were still about ten cars in the city to be heard from, another 40 around Conception Bay, and 10 others on Bell Island. He believed the greater part of these cars would be registered very shortly, so that the Commission together with the \$10,000 grant from the Government would have the handling of about \$20,000 this season.
