Sin,—I am commanded by His Excel-lency the Lieutenant-Governor to inform, you that His Excellency has been advised that the whole duty of examining pupils for the admission to High Schools and Collegiate Institutes, including the set-lement of Examination questions rests with the Board of Examiners constituted by the 38th Section of the School Act of 1878, (34 Vic., Cap. 33), and that the re-sults of Examinations by the Board upon athletics of the School Act of the Gouncil of Public Instruction are con-clusive, and are not subject to the super-vision of the High School Inspector. In the Gonneil of Public Instruction are con-clusive, and are not subject to the super-vision of the High Shool Inspector. In prescribing the programme of the Exam-nations, and Regulations respecting the same, the Council of Public Instruction has been advised that it is desirable the utmost facility should be afforded for the admission of pupils to the High Schools, consistent with their showing that amount of previous training without which it is improbable that they could obtain any advantages from the further proceention of their studies in the High School.
