Dr. Olsen, of Norway has invest! gated various cheeses, and has caught and cultivated their microbes, then he has reversed the process, and used his cultures to produce the various cheeses from which he started. The kinds of microbes are not many, but by their combination in different proportions different results are otbained. The milk is sterilized and heated to 70 degrees to 75 degrees C., and the storeroom is kept guarded against foreign microbes. Those that are desired are added in the requisite proportions, and their vigorous growth is of itself enough to overcome the influence of accidental strays.
