Hon. W. E. Raney, Attorney-General, Will Seek Election in North Victoria Riding, While Minister of Agriculture Will Be Candidate in South Wellington.

KITCHENER BODY OPPOSES HYDRO RADIAL BYLAW

**Street Railway Commission
Objects to Outside Body
Controlling Streets.**

Kitchener, Dec. 18.—The local commission, which operates the Kitchener-Waterloo street railway, has gone on record as opposed to the hydro-railway

bylaw to be submitted to the ratepayers on January 1.

In the resolution passed by the commission it is maintained that the company is handicapped by lack of power, with no relief in sight until the Chipewake development is completed.

In addition the commission thinks it unwise to hand over the control of the city streets to an outside body.

**\$47,100 Added Today Bring
\$2,104,720 Total.**

December building figures have again leaped upward to the extent of \$47,100

in one day. This amount was added to day, when permits for two more residences for the London housing commission were issued, and a report was made on the building at the Ontario Hospital during the year.

MONTENEGRINS AND

SERBIANS ENGAGE IN HEAVY FIGHTING

Serbiens Charged With Placing Women and Children in Front.

Paris, Dec. 18.—Fierce fighting by the Montenegrin people against the Serbian occupation occurred around Cetinje between December 1 and December 12. It is declared in an official communique today from the foreign ministry of the

Montenegrin Government, the seat of which is in a suburb of Paris. The statement asserts that the Serbians had placed women and children in front of them to prevent the Montenegrins defending themselves. The Government of Montenegro, the announcement adds, has reiterated its protest to the peace
