The annual hoop race of the seniors of Wellesley College, feature of the May Day festivities. The winner of the race is considered to be the first of her class who will get married



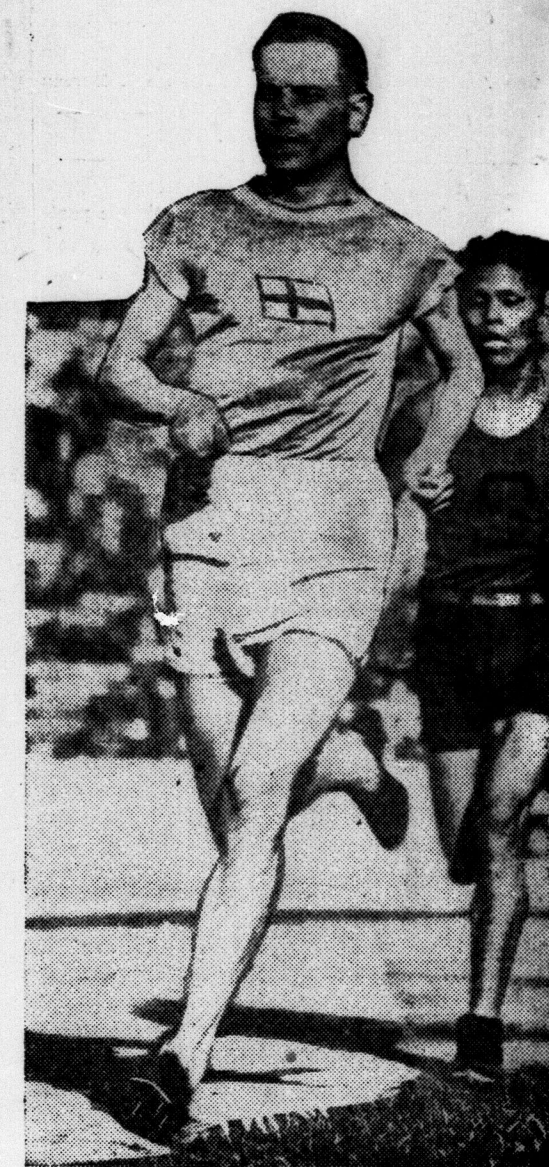
Sir Gilbert Clayton, who is likely to be appointed high commissioner of Palestine to succeed Sir Herbert Samuel

Paavo Nurmi in action. Just at present he is the idle idol, while his expense accounts are under scrutiny



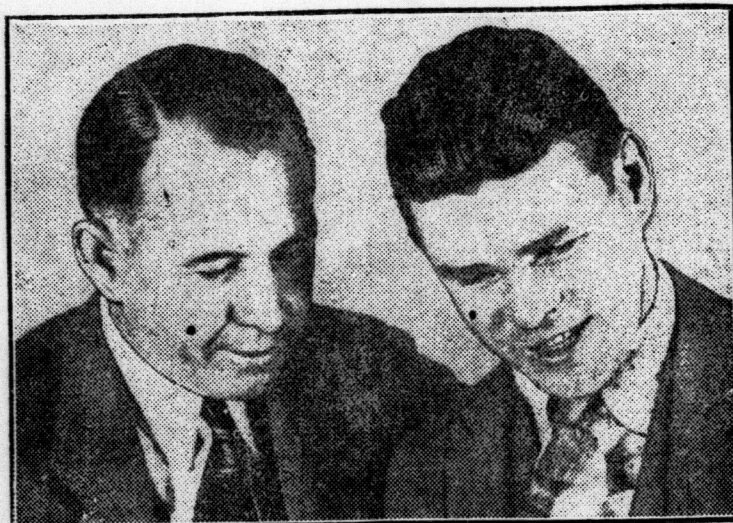
Fire devouring the S.S. Canadian Navigator. A lifeboat carrying members of the crew is seen in the foreground

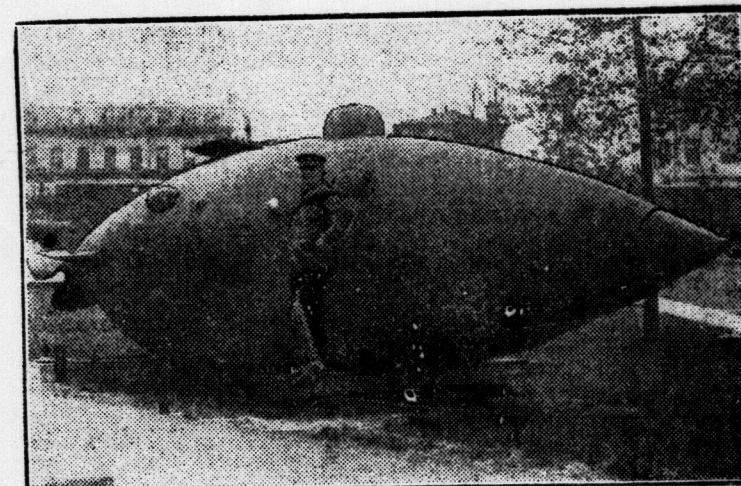
Mischa Elman, internationally famous violinist, visits Elinor Glyn at her studio
