INSURANCE RESERVES

Will Continue Assessable According Mr. Baxter's bill to amend the Assessment Act by exempting the reserve fund of insurance companies from taxation was satisfactorily disposed of in the Municipal Committee yesterday morning. The measure was framed much on the same lines as that of Mr. O'Connor in regard to gas mains and electric light plant, the object being to override a decision of Judge McDougall's by which insurance companies reserves are made taxable. Mr. J. K. Kerr, Q.C., J. K. Macdonald, W. McCabe, H. Sutherland and others were heard in support of the bill, which was opposed by Mr. Caswell. A vote on the principle of the bill being taken it was thrown out by a vote of 9 to 5. Mr. Tait votsd against the bill. Messrs. Clarke and Ryerson did not vote. Mr. McMahon's bill modifying in some cases the oath administered to voters was also defeated. 


