Municipalities Invest Hydro Surplus in Victory Bonds

Many rural municipalities which have benefited by hydro development are now giving their surplus prosperity to help along with the Victory Loan, as a number of communicat-ions have been received of late by the Hydro Commission from municipalities at scattered points asking the Commission if they might be permitted to invest their Hydro surplus in the bonds. Investigation by the Commission of the finances of the municipalities heard from shows that they have a surplus aggregating practically \$250,000, and the Commission is now advising that it be invested in the bonds. All the municipalities concerned are quite small, with populations around the twohundred mark, and this, in addition to reflecting a generally healthy financial condition among the smaller centres, shows just what can be done by the Hydro.



She threw all this away when she wantonly made war for plunder. "We willed this war," said Herr Harden in 1914, when her treachery seemed to promise magnificent results.
