- MACKINAW, probably from: mikenakw, (Abenakis), a tortoise; also, a species of waterbug.
- MACCAN RIVER; Mââgan, (Micmac), fishing place.
- MADAWASKA; matawaska, (Otchipwe), madobaskika, (Abenakis), the mouth of a river where there are grass and hay. The local term is madobaskikak.
- MARUAPSKASIK, (Abenakis), is the name of a short portage, on the St Francis River, above the Abenakis village, which means: at the red rock.
- MAMPHREMAGOG, (Abenakis), for, Mamlaw-bagak, signifies; long and large sheet of water, from: mamlaw..., a prefix which denotes largeness or abundance, baga, a particule denoting water, and, k, which marks that the name is given in local term.
- MASKIKOWOGAMAK, (Abenakis), the lake the banks of which are covered with grass or hay.
- MASKUAANAGASIK, (Abenakis), the diminutive of maskuaanagak: the little birch-trees island, or simply, the birch island. This is the name of a little island on the River St Francis.
- MASSACHUSETTS, either from: "Massajosets," the tribe of the great hill, or, Msajosek, at the great hill or region of the great hills.
