ganized government, to ftretch forth its protecting arm, in any cafe of danger, the misery might have been in a degree alleviated. But the infancy of our country did not admit of this bleffing. While Governor Shirley of Maffachusetts, was petitioning to England for a fleet and an army, Benning Wentworth the fupine Governor of Newhampshire, obeyed implicitly the advice of his friend Shirley, and remained inactively fecure at his feat at Portsmouth. At the commencement of the year seventeenhundred and forty five, the Quixotick expedition to Louisburg was projected, the fuccels of which origin. sted from the mereft accident, rather than from military valor or generalship; this drained the thinly inhabited state of Newhampfhire of most of its effective men. From that period till the peace, which took place in the year seventeen hundred and forty nine, the visionary fchemes of A<sub>2</sub> Shirley
