THE CANADIAN PRIMATE ON CHURCH PARTIES.—The last Provincial The Canadian Primate of Church Parties.—The last Provincial Synod of Canada was opened with a very remarkable address from the Metropolitan, the venerable Bishop of Fredericton. A local paper happily describes it as characterized by "brilliant simplicity, fervent charity, and wealth of wisdom gained by long and deep knowledge of mon and their work." The address opens by saying that "the question with Canadian Churchmen used to be, What is England going to do for us 'Now we have to face the just as serious question, What are we going to do for Canada! In answer to this the address points out "dangers and duties."
