CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

Dealers are booking a considerable number of orders for small lots of lumber and seem to be satisfied with the condition of trade, although it can hardly be said that the fall movement has as yet commenced with full vigor. Holders of lumber appear to have no apprehension as to their ability to dispose of their stocks at satisfactory prices, consequently there is no pronounced pressure on the market. White pine, however, is showing an uneven tendency. Export grades and No. 3 cuts and better have weakened slightly, the common grades remain stationary, while box lumber, mill cull sidings, and dead culls are slightly stiffer from the standpoint of manufacturer's prices. It is not anticipated that prices as a whole will materially change during the next few weeks, and it is almost certain that there will be no further decline. There is a very liberal demand for hemlock at firmer prices. Inch stock is unchanged, but many manufacturers are holding their two inch at an advance of from 50 cents to one dollar. The sizes 2, 6 and 8 inch, 12 to 20 feet, are showing the most strength. Shingles are steady, while lath prices are a little weaker. No. 2 spruce and hemlock lath are off about 20 cents, and now sell at the mills at \$1.60.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

As there is very little activity in lumber shipping circles in the Eastern Provinces, the demand being unusually light, interest is centered on logging operations. In this connection a peculiar situation has arisen. The operators decided to restrict the output of logs by at least 40 per cent., and unless they can secure the necessary help at what they consider reasonable wages, it is quite possible that the production may be still further curtailed. The wages paid last winter were from \$28 to \$32 per month, and the men are asking \$28 this season. Many of the operators are refusing to pay more than \$20 per month, and unless they can secure a sufficient number of men at this rate, they will restrict their production accordingly. The general opinion is that while spruce lumber prices have reached bottom, the improvement is likely to be slow. United States shipments have increased of late at unchanged prices. New Brunswick shingles are still dull and weak.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

Moderate activity characterizes the lumber trade of Manitoba, the Territories and British Columbia. The outlook for the wheat crop induced some stocking up on the part of dealers a few weeks ago, but
