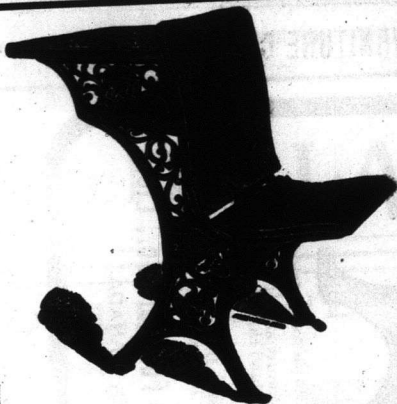

The first number of the eighth volume of that progressive magazine, *Acadiensis*, has been issued. Among the contributed articles are Notes on the Historical Geography of New Brunswick, by Dr. W. F.
