

Did you know that the mailroom handles almost 19,000 pieces of mail per day and by-hand deliveries just in Ottawa rack up enough kilometres to make 12.5 trips around the world every year? Or that we make 400 office moves per year in HQ alone, print 61 million pages of text, process 1.2 million financial transactions and transmit 2 billion words of message traffic with 12 million photocopies? Overseas we manage almost 1800 staff quarters and did you know that this Department owns real estate worth \$4 billion and constructs or purchases buildings at the rate of \$40 million per year?

All this, and a lot more, is the day-to-day work of the group toiling behind the scenes to keep our Department moving and functioning. But these days, the M Branch ain't what it used to be. The Branch that everyone likes to kick around is undergoing big changes. The Corporate Review not only changed the face of the Branch (the Passport Office left and COSICS, MCBA, MIX and MIV moved in) but it is also producing changes in the way the Branch performs its work, meets requirements of laws and regulation and basically helps us get things done.
