

Motions for Papers

Mr. Fleming (Eglinton): Yes, they are separate. I should add that no sales commission or issuing fee is payable in respect of bonds converted by the Bank of Canada, government accounts or chartered banks for their head office portfolios. Moreover, there is a list of about 2,500 names including all the large corporate investors in Canada who are being covered on a co-operative basis by the investment dealers under the direction of a national committee. In the case of conversions by these corporate investors, the rate of commission is one-quarter of one per cent on the three and one-quarter year 3 per cent bond, and one-half of one per cent on all other maturities. It will be seen that this is substantially reduced from the ordinary commission available.

The answer to the second question is that there have been savings bonds campaigns in the years 1955, 1956 and 1957. In every case the commission paid was three-quarters of one per cent. The issuing and redemption fee in all cases was one-quarter of one per cent.

It is quite clear that the average rate of commission paid in the total on the conversions on the Canadian conversion loan of 1958 will be less than that paid on the Canada savings bond issues in any of the years that are referred to in the question of my hon. friend.
