A bill of this kind is put before us each year, with the same preamble referring to Her Majesty the Queen as if we had to ask for her authorization to run our country, to get the funds necessary to face the administrative obligations and expenses. I feel, Mr. Chairman, that this wording is obsolete, that we should use a different wording to express ourselves in a language all Canadians understand.

The Chairman: Order, please. I must point out to the hon. member that the point he is raising is not a point of order which can be accepted for the moment and, secondly, that it is not permitted in this House to cast a reflection upon Her Majesty the Queen nor upon our institutions. So, I have to tell him that his point of order is not acceptable, and I hope we will be able to move along now.
